INSPECTION CHECKLIST

- Check electrical appliances and wiring for frayed wire. They can cause fires.
- Replace worn or damaged cords.
- Never overload extension cords or wall sockets.
- Have a working smoke detector in your bedroom and outside your bedroom.
- Have clear paths to your exits.
- Keep BBQs away from buildings.
- Never smoke in bed.
- Ensure that electrically powered equipment is either CSA or Ontario Hydro Special Inspection label approved.

GETTING OUT

FEEL THE DOOR HANDLE

- Feel the handle with the back of your hand. Do not grab the handle as there could be an electrical current running through it.
- If the handle is hot, don't open it.
- Go to a window and yell for help.

GET OUT OF THE BUILDING BEFORE CALLING FOR HELP

- Don't take time to phone before leaving.
- Get out and then find a phone.

CRAWL LOW TO THE FLOOR

- Thick smoke can make it difficult to see.
- Toxic chemicals in smoke can be deadly.

CLOSE DOORS AS YOU LEAVE ROOMS

- You will prevent the fire from spreading.
- You may protect your valuables from damage.

GET SOMEONE'S ATTENTION

- YELL and SCREAM for help!
- Hang a sheet from a window.
- Meet in your pre-determined designated meeting area.

PREVENTION

- Take responsibility for protecting your life and valuables.
- Never overload electrical outlets.
- Keep space heaters and halogen bulbs away from flammables.
- Never leave a fire unattended.
- Avoid unsafe cooking practices
- Dispose cigarette butts and ashes in the proper non-combustible containers.
- Put out candles when unattended.

PROTECTION

- -CHECK SMOKE ALARMS
- Change the battery semi-annually and test monthly.
- Check expiry on detectors.
- Clean your smoke alarm monthly by running your vacuum over it.

PLAN ESCAPE ROUTES

- Know where your exits are located
- Practice your plan.

"STOP, DROP, AND ROLL"

Propane Fill Station Emergency Protocol

In the event of an incident involving the propane refill station by the recreation hall at the front of the park, the following plan has been developed. Even if you are not directly in the perimeter boundaries, you should make yourself aware of the evacuation plan.

An area of 300 meters (radius) has been identified as a risk and will be required to be evacuated. Your residence or trailer may be within this distance, or you may be affected if you visit the office, beach, rec. shed, laundry room etc. You will be notified by either phone or in person.

The perimeter boundaries are from Pike lake Road main entrance, to the north pump house past A-10 & A-17, to the south at the starters gazebo, to the east hole #1on the links course, B-01, B-12, B-24 to the lake.

The plan is for you to leave immediately and safely. Proceed to the motel parking lot and advise a staff member there



that you are safe and your residence is empty. This will assist us in accounting for all persons within the evacuation area.

If you are unable to leave for whatever reason, contact the motel and we will attempt to evacuate you as soon as possible. No one will be allowed back in until the area has been identified as safe.

Propane will follow the landscape to the lowest point and accumulate; any ignition can cause an explosion. For example, starting a car or golf cart, smoking, etc.

When exiting move away from the hazard, keeping buildings between you and the propane compound.

This information has been developed in case of an emergency. The chances for such an event are very log, but being prepared is essential.

Carbon Monoxide - Stop This Silent Killer

Ah, camping – a safe, fun and relaxing experience in the great outdoors, right? Well, nothing's perfect. There's a silent killer on the loose, and it's called carbon monoxide (CO). You can't smell it, see it, or taste this invisible, odourless gas. But you can stop this silent killer. Here's how:

CAMP SAFETY – WITHOUT THE RISK OF CARBON MONOXIDE For Campers, Trailers and RVs:

- 1. Never block the combustion exhaust vent on the outside wall of your RV or trailer.
- 2. Never construct an enclosed space around the vent (where the exhaust cannot escape).
- 3. Have a certified fuels technician inspect and maintain your propane equipment annually.
- 4. Install a CO alarm and propane leak alarm.
- 4. Use designated spaces for storage and transportation of gas cylinders.

If the trailer contains a fuel burning appliance a CO alarm is required by law to be installed adjacent to each sleeping area in the house.

For Tents: Never use portable fuel-burning equipment, such as portable propane/kerosene heaters, stoves or BBQ's, in your tent or any enclosed space.
